


Desert Botanical Garden






Ask about the Garden's year-round concert series, butterfly pavilion, cultural festivals and our popular winter celebration, *Las Noches de las Luminarias*.

CACTUS WREN

Active all year

When the cactus wren talks, people listen: its distinctive call makes this one of Arizona's most vocal birds.

ROUND-TAILED GROUND SQUIRREL

Spring through fall



Often compared to a miniature prairie dog, this desert dweller lives in burrows underground.



GAMBEL'S QUAIL

Active all year

An endearing sight, these quail travel as a family unit, heads bobbing in unison.

DESERT TORTOISE

Spring through fall



Slow but steady wins the race, and the desert tortoise can prove it: this reptile lives as long as 60 to 100 years.

DESERT SPINY LIZARD

Spring through fall



Though he may look fierce, this lizard is actually shy, preferring to bask in solitude at the top of a rock pile or in a tree.



BLACK-TAILED JACKRABBIT

Active all year


As a type of hare, the jackrabbit is born road ready, able to hop around almost immediately after birth.
