

About Our Garden Trails

The entrance of the trail to our Garden is 120 feet above sea level. The trail down into the Garden is 500 feet long and quite steep. Walk slowly and hold on to the guard rails.

This trail was very difficult to construct because of large rocks and the uneven land surface. You might consider the trail to be a long bridge built above the rocks to preserve the natural beauty of the small valley where it is located.

Within the Garden, the trails are quite level and easy to walk on. It will take you approximately two hours to walk all of the trails and enjoy the beauty of the Garden. It will take longer if you stop to take photos or sit to enjoy the spectacular views.

Umbrellas are provided free at gate or rain shelters, please return them as you leave.

- PLEASE WATCH YOUR CHILDREN CAREFULLY - KEEP THEM WITHIN YOUR SIGHT.
- Do not lean on guard rails along the trails.
- Do not pick plants or fruits; some are poisonous. You may sample seasonal fruits which have fallen from the trees, such as mangoes, guavas and passion fruit.
- Do not litter.
