

Welcome to the one of the scenic wonders of the world - Monument Valley. Located on the northern Arizona border and southern Utah border, Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park offers spectacular views of buttes, mesas, canyons and free standing rock formations that will take your breath away.

Created from materials eroded from the early Rocky Mountains and deposited with earlier layers for the formation of stratified buttes, Monument Valley has withstood the test of time. The cutler red sandstone formations are part of the Grand Circle and have been documented in John Ford westerns, movies and television commercials the world over.

This Navajo Tribal Park is part of the Colorado Plateau and is called Tse' Bii' Mistsigani, or the Valley of the Rocks. With an elevation of 5,584 feet above sea level, Monument Valley stretches across Arizona and Utah with 91,898 acres.

MITTEN VIEW CAMPGROUND FACILITY


Obey all signs.
 Stay on self guided valley road.
 Respect the privacy of Navajo people.
 Permission to photograph residents is required and a gratuity is expected.
 Commercial photos require a permit from Navajo Parks & Recreation.
 Pets must be leashed at all times.
 No rock climbing allowed.
 No alcoholic beverages allowed.

Wildcat Nature Trail is 3.2 miles. Fires are only permitted in grills. No open fires allowed. Do not litter. Dispose of trash properly in trash containers. Do not disturb plants, rocks, or artifacts.
 Use caution around rocks and holes. Natural wildlife abound. Quiet hours are from 11 p.m. to 8 a.m. in the campground.

Primitive/Wildcat Campground is open year-round on a first come, first serve basis. Be sure to register at the entrance before picking out your campsite to ensure availability. Prices are subject to change without prior notice.


